

Fluency Classroom Activity

Timed Reading Passages

Overview

Fluent readers do not just recognize words quickly; they read smoothly and with understanding. This activity helps students build fluency by reading short passages aloud, tracking words per minute (WPM), and rereading to improve speed, accuracy, and expression.

Focus: Rereading for accuracy, automaticity, and expression

Grade Range: K-2

Goal: Build fluency by reading short, decodable passages aloud with repeated practice.

Materials Needed

- Printed reading passage pages for students
- Printed reading passage tracking pages for the teacher
- Stopwatch or timer
- Pencils or highlighters
- Optional: fluency progress tracker

Instructions

- 1. **Model the Process:** Choose a sample passage and read it aloud to demonstrate smooth phrasing and expression.
- 2. **Timed Reading:** Have the student read the passage aloud for 1 minute. Count the number of words read correctly. Stop at 1 minute and mark the last word read. Note any skipped or misread words.
- **3. Reread and Reflect:** Encourage the student to reread the same passage. Discuss what felt easier and where improvements were made.
- **4. Track Progress:** Record results using the tracker: WPM and errors. Use repeated readings over time to build confidence.









Tips for Differentiation

- Select passages at the student's instructional level.
- Use simpler passages with more decodable patterns for early readers.
- Encourage repeated readings over several days to boost confidence and mastery.
- Practice timed reading with other texts on the students' reading level.

Wrap-Up Questions

- What did you notice about your second reading?
- Which part felt smoother?
- How does it feel to read something more than once?
